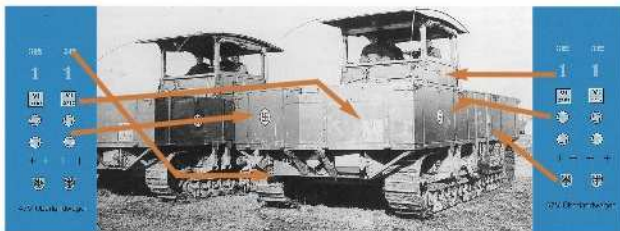




German Army vehicles during the First World War were painted in various shades of field grey. Covered in this set are various tracked and wheeled vehicles, most of them carrying the black and white eagle emblem.

## A7V Überlandwagen

Four octagonals with swastika's (combine two decals for this) on right front and left back, and at the front of the sides. On the other oblique front and back is the vehicle registration number. The turret sides sport the vehicle number '1'. In the middle of the sides is the eagle emblem. One vehicle is known to have only carried the eagle emblem on the side, without any other markings.



## Extra's

Extra eagle emblems as carried on trucks: sometimes on the doors, sometimes on the sides.



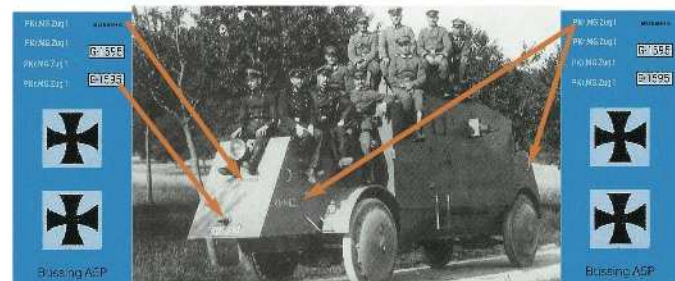
## Büssing KZW 1800

Again just the eagle emblems on the sides.



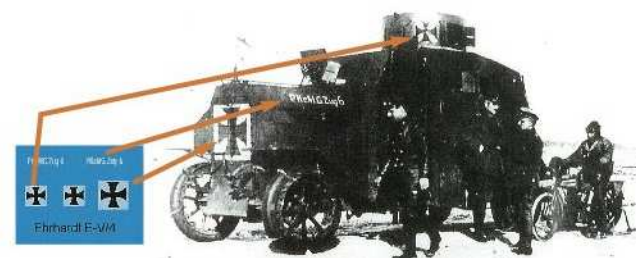
## Büssing A5P

Elaborate markings on this vehicle, which markings varied in time. There was only one vehicle. Markings are for the top photo configuration, the large crosses are optional.



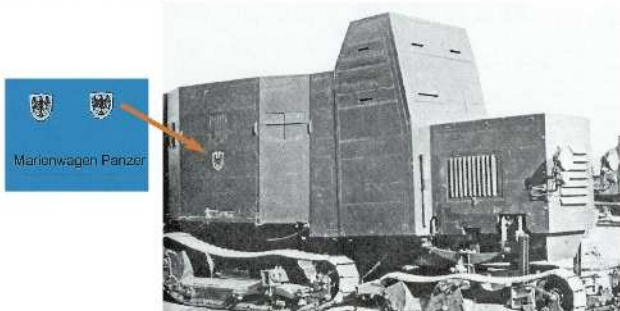
## Erhardt E-V/4

This wheeled vehicle, apparently covered in quite a dark field grey variant, carries crosses on the turret sides and on the front, with denomination 'PKrMG.Zug 6' on the bonnet sides.



## Marienwagen Panzer

Just two eagle emblems on the sides.



## Lancia 1Z

Most visible are the crosses on the side doors. Behind the crosses the code G2 is visible. On the oblique side of the bonnet is printed: 'Pkr.Mg.Zug 11'. This vehicle has some illegible text on the sides, possibly handwritten.
